

## Findings and Decisions Following Fitness to Practise Committee Inquiries (Nurses Act, 1985)

Findings of the Fitness to Practise Committee: Professional misconduct

## **Allegations proven:**

That you, being a registered nurse, while employed at X Hospital, (the "Hospital"):

On one or more of the following dates, requisitioned some or all of the following medication for X Ward of the Hospital in circumstances where you knew ought to have known that some or all of the medication was not required for patient use:

- On or around 18 August 2010, requisitioned a supply of diazepam 5mg tablets and/or diazepam 2mg tablets;
- On or around 18 August 2010, requisitioned a supply of Surmontil 50mg tablets;
- On or around 3 September 2010, requisitioned a supply of Surmontil 50mg tablets;
- On or around 25 September 20 I 0, requisitioned a supply of Surmontil 50mg tablets and/or Xanax 0.25mg tablets;
- On or around 13 October 2010, requisitioned a supply of Surmontil 50mg tablets and/or diazepam 5mg tablets;
- On or around 10 November 2010, requisitioned a supply of Surmontil 50mg tablets;
- On or around 27 November 2010, requisitioned a supply of Surmontil 50mg tablets and/or Xanax 0.25mg tablets;
- On or around 1 December 2010, requisitioned a supply of Surmontil 50mg tablets;

• On or around 9 December 2010, requisitioned a supply of Xanax 0.25mg tablets;

On one or more unspecified dates between on or about 18 August 2010 and on or about 1 December 2010, without any or adequate authority, took from X Ward of the Hospital, one or more of the following tablets, when you knew or ought to have known that this was not appropriate:

• 154 Surmontil 50mg tablets;

Supplied and/or provided one or more of the tablets referred to above to Ms A, staff member of the Hospital, when you knew or ought to have known that this was inappropriate.

**Sanction:** Pursuant to Section 39 (1) of the Nurses Act, 1985, Ms. McHugh's name was **erased** from the register of nurses and midwives (the Register). The decision to erase Ms. McHugh's name from the Register was confirmed by the High Court on 10<sup>th</sup> October 2016.
