

Findings and Decisions Following Fitness to Practise Committee (Nurses Act, 1985) Inquiries

NAME: Ms Meenu Bajaj; PIN: 115998

Finding of the Fitness to Practise Committee: Professional Misconduct

Allegations proven:

That you, being a registered midwife, while working at Hospital X, on or around 31 July 2008 and/or 1 August 2008 and whilst providing care to Ms A who was experiencing a miscarriage:

- Failed to afford Ms A and/or Mr A any or any adequate opportunity to see and/or hold the fetus:
- Failed to remove the fetus from the amniotic sac, in circumstances where you knew
 or ought to have known that this was appropriate and/or failed to demonstrate any or
 any adequate knowledge and/or understanding of how to remove the fetus from the
 amniotic sac;
- Failed to maintain accurate and/or complete and/or legible midwifery records in relation to Ms A and/or her fetus when you knew or ought to have known that this was in breach of the An Bord Altranais *Recording Clinical Practice Guidance to Nurses and Midwives*, 1st edition, November 2002 and/or the An Bord Altranais *Guidelines for Midwives*, 3rd Edition, September 2001 in circumstances where:
 - o in your note dated 1 August 2008 timed at 00.00 hours you:
 - failed to record the complete name of the medication referred to as "synto"; and
 - o in your note dated 1 August 2008 timed at 00.30 hours you:

- failed to record the complete name of the medication referred to as "synto"; and
- failed to record whether Ms A and/or Mr A were afforded an opportunity to see the fetus and/or failed to record the wishes of Ms A and/or Mr A with regard to seeing and/or holding the fetus; and
- failed to record any discussion(s) with Ms A and/or Mr A in relation to the placenta; and
- o in your note dated 1 August 2008 timed at 1.00 hours you:
 - failed to record the complete name of the medication referred to as "synto"; and
- Arising from some or all of allegations above, fell seriously short of the standard of conduct expected of a midwife.

Sanction: Pursuant to Section 41(1) of the Nurses Act, 1985, Ms Bajaj was **advised** in relation to her professional conduct.
