

What is the purpose of the Code?

The purpose of the Code is to guide nurses and midwives in their day to day practice and help them understand their professional responsibilities in caring for patients in a safe, ethical and effective way.

Legislative basis – The Nurses and Midwives Act (2011).

- 5. Collaboration with others.

Code of Professional Conduct and Ethics for Registered Nurses and Registered Midwives

- Legislative changes -
 - Health (Regulations of Termination of Pregnancy) Act (2018)
 - Data Protection Act (2018)
 - Patient Safety Bill (2018)
 - Assisted Decision Making (Capacity) Act (2015)
 - Civil Liability (Amendment) Act (2017)
 - National policy documents
 - Update the Code Consultation regarding the recent Statement of Strategy (NMBI)
 - Take cognisance of the practice and care settings where nurses and midwives work.
